Possessive nouns show that something belongs to one or more people, places, or things.

Use **'s** to show possession for one person, place, or thing—**Ann's** coat.

Use **s'** to show possession for more than one person, place, or thing—the **farmers'** crops.

Use **'s** to show possession for nouns with irregular plural forms—the **men's** team.
