Pronoun-Antecedent Agreement

The noun that a pronoun replaces is called an antecedent. A pronoun and its antecedent must match in number (one or more than one) and gender (male or female).

- Repetitious: Maria lost Maria's scarf, but Maria found it at the end of the day.
- Better: Maria lost her scarf, but she found it at the end of the day.

In the example, Maria, her, and she match because they all refer to one girl.

Place periods inside quotation marks. If the speaker is identified after the dialogue, place a comma inside the final quotation mark. If the dialogue itself ends in a question mark or exclamation point, place it inside the final quotation mark and drop the comma.


