Irregular Verbs

A regular verb ends in **-ed** or **-d** in the past tense. Irregular verbs, however, do not follow this rule. The spelling of irregular verbs can change in many different ways between the present and past tense forms.

make	made
find	found
get	got
buy	bought
is	are

grow	make	grew	made	found
find	get	buy	got	bought

Some verbs are irregular and do not follow any spelling rules for forming the plural or past tense of the verb. The verbs **to be** and **have** are examples of irregular verbs.
