## Comparatives and Superlatives

Comparative adjectives or adverbs compare two places or things. Superlative adjectives or adverbs compare three or more places or things. Most comparatives end in **-er**, while most superlatives end in **-est**. For longer adjectives or adverbs, use the word **more** to form the comparative and the word **most** to form the superlative. Some comparatives and superlatives, however, are irregular and do not follow any of these patterns. For example:

	Comparative	Superlative
good	better	best
bad	worse	worst

## Pronoun-Antecedent Agreement

Writers use pronouns to replace the repetition of a noun. The noun that a pronoun replaces is called an antecedent. A pronoun and its antecedent must match in number (one or more than one) and gender (male or female).

**Repetitive:** Sergio went to **Sergio's** class, and **Sergio** sat in **Sergio's** seat.

**Better:** Sergio went to **his** class, and **he** sat in **his** seat.
