

Reciprocal Pronouns

Use the reciprocal pronouns **each other** or **one another** when two or more people or things are performing the same action and are both affected by the action in the same way. **Each other** refers to two people or things. **One another** refers to three or more people or things.

Bella and Drew smiled at **each other**.

After the game, the players on both teams high-fived **one another**.

Parts of Speech

The part of speech of a word tells how a word is meant to be used in speaking or writing, as a noun, pronoun, verb, adjective, or adverb.

Part of Speech	Example
Nouns:	Alexa loves burgers .
Pronouns:	Will you text me later?
Verbs:	Dan is an avid reader. His parents are proud of him. He reads two books a week.
Adjectives:	It has been so hot and dry .
Adverbs:	I really wish it would rain.
